### **Position Overview**

The London Children's Museum is seeking a strategic and relationship-oriented fundraising generalist to join our team. The Director of Development is a key leadership role, working closely with the Executive Director and Development Associate to create and implement a comprehensive annual fundraising strategy and complete the new London Children's Museum capital campaign. This individual will focus on building and maintaining a strong donor base, securing financial support, and advancing the mission of the London Children's Museum. The ideal candidate will be an excellent communicator and strategic thinker with a passion for building relationships and making connections with the community.

### **Key Responsibilities**

- **Donor Relationships & Stewardship:** Develop and maintain strong relationships with individual donors, foundations, corporations, and government agencies. Foster donor loyalty through exceptional stewardship and communication.
- **Fundraising Strategy:** Collaborate with the Executive Director to develop and implement a multifaceted fundraising strategy. Identify new opportunities for revenue growth, including individual giving, corporate sponsorships, grants, and major gifts.
- **Grant & Proposal Writing:** Lead the creation and submission of compelling grant proposals to secure funding from foundations, government programs, and other grant-making organizations.
- **Event & Program Sponsorships:** Lead efforts to secure sponsorships for museum events, programs, and exhibitions, ensuring mutually beneficial partnerships.
